PORT AUGUSTA EXPERIENTIAL STUDIO

The students of the School of Architecture of the University of Adelaide will spend a week in Port Augusta from the 18th to the 22nd of September and will participate in an intensive workshop on site. The students are Master students in Architecture and Landscape architecture enrolled in the Course ARCH 7037 - Experiential Studio: Onshore (M).

The School of Architecture and Built Environment has been working in Port Augusta developing similar studios in the last years. This is our fifth studio in Port Augusta.

The workshop will provide an opportunity for students to learn from a full immersion experience in an Australian regional community in strict relation with the local residents and government.

The studio will be organised in close cooperation with the local City Council Planning office and local Aboriginal community representatives. The students will produce ideas and research material that will support the Council planning office in the development of a revitalization Plan for the central areas.

This Urban Design studio is the third phase of a design/research/action initiative that potentially will lead towards the implementation of some of the ideas proposed.

TOPIC OF THE STUDIO

The topic of the Studio is: " Making a centre: re-imagining the urban space in Port Augusta ".

The Studio will offer the opportunity to approach urban design and urban regeneration through an accurate understanding of the local spatial and cultural context.

The themes developed will include cultural heritage, cross-cultural issues on public space, underused space recycling, urban consolidation, water/climate sensitive urban design, innovative mobility, innovative energy paradigms, optimization of existing infrastructure, etc. finalised to a proposal for a more environmentally sustainable and socially equitable public urban space. The workshop will also



look closely to the sustainable development of the local community through the development of a public space regeneration proposal.

ACTIVITIES

During the 2015 intensive workshop, the students have been surveying the Port Augusta CBD area for five days, collecting data on maps, drawing, taking pictures, measuring, etc. They have produced a comprehensive surveys and action plans proposals of the CBD and coast line. In 2016 a new group of students travelled to Port Augusta to present and discuss with the local residents, representatives of the community and of the local government the finding from the previous year. They developed an urban design proposal for the public open spaces of the CBD and the waterfront areas of Port Augusta.

This year, for the third time, the students will be back in Port Augusta. As last year, the work will be based on the previous findings, proposals and on the feedback that we will receive from the meetings with the community. The scope of the work will be to re-imagining the urban space in Port Augusta with the aim to create a new attractive town centre.

The proposals will be finalised once back in Adelaide, on the base of the data and information gathered.

We are planning to meet the representatives of the local stakeholders and the Aboriginal Community during an open workshop, on <u>Tuesday the 19th of September, from 9.30 am to 1.00 pm</u>.

The students will present the materials and proposals developed during last year's workshop for the areas of the CBD and the waterfront of Port Augusta. An open discussion will follow with the aim to collect feedback and the community's proposals.

The purpose of the workshop will be to explore possible ideas emerging from a consultation with the local inhabitants and users of the public open space in the Port August city centre.

A lunch will follow. After lunch we would like to invite the main local stakeholders and inhabitants to a walk with us along streets and he spaces of the CBD and share with us their views on possible future scenarios for Port Augusta.

DELIVERABLES AND ASSESSMENTS

Assignment 1 - (group work) - 30%

- Banner (42x118.8cm vertical) containing: title, slogan, text 500 words, concept idea
- One A2 page (42x59.4cm page vertical) with masterplan, containing: plan scale 1:2000/1:500, renders, details)
- 3' film/performance with personal experience of the study area

Assignment 2 - (individual work) – 30%

- Reflective journal (A4 booklet with minimum 2500 words with photos, sketches, etc.) containing:
 - Diary of Journey in Port Augusta with detailed description of activities undertaken
 - Report of community discussions
 - Critical comments to studio experience

Assignment 3 - (individual work) - 40%

- One A2 page (42x59.4cm - page vertical) with designed proposal for assigned area (scale 1:500/1:200/1:20/renders, etc.) to be published in a booklet.

Each assignment must be uploaded on MyUni in <u>one</u> pdf file format (file maximum 10 Mb) containing the deliverables before the due date.
